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Orientation Programme for the Research Scholars and Faculty Members belonging to Scheduled Tribes and other Marginalized Groups from March 28th to 31st March 2016. Social Science Research is characterized by a diversity of theoretical perspectives, paradigms, methodologies, strategies, data collection practices and analysis of facts. The training and orientation for young researchers and faculties is essential to equip them with advanced methodological skills and techniques of data collection. It has been observed that many researchers are not having capacity to produce qualitative research because they are either not in touch with the latest research tools and techniques or do not have proper orientation to use the traditional research methods efficiently. It has also been noticed that many scholars marginalized groups particularly Scheduled Castes have lesser access to quality learning to refine their knowledge and methodological skills and to get insight of emerging areas of research in their respective fields.

The contemporary society is facing multidimensional problems generated out of liberalization, privatization and globalization such as poverty, unemployment, unequal distribution of resources, denial of equal opportunities, discrimination and exploitation in employment market; untouchability, atrocities, gender discrimination and violence against women especially the Dalit women, child abuse, child labor, bonded labor, beggary, groupism etc. For the holistic understanding and finding out solution for solving social problems social science research is necessary to establish cause and effect relationship of the process of social change and development. The social science researchers need to update their knowledge and sharpen the understanding by making use of latest tools and techniques of social science research. In view of significance of social science research Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University of Social Sciences (BRAUSS) is organizing a Four days Orientation Programme for the Research Scholars and Faculty Members belonging to Scheduled Tribes and other disadvantaged groups from 28th March to 31st March 2016 sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi.

The objectives of this course are to help young scholars and faculties to acquire extensive and intensive knowledge and understanding on the various aspects of research methods and techniques of social science research. The orientation program attempts to cover philosophical and methodological issues emerging in social science research.
